- Muktaa Charitable Foundation is a not-for-profit, public trust formed by socially conscious citizens (Registration no: Maha 1215/2010 Pune).
- Muktaa began its journey on 5th October 2005 and till March 2011: took
 78098 calls
- Envisaged, shaped and managed by like-minded individuals, Muktaa has been steadily gaining ground in its fight against the HIV/AIDS epidemic.
- Muktaa is run by dedicated volunteers, with highly trained paid counselors who attend the calls at the helpline

Journey from 2010 to 2011

Muktaa to Samvad

Following ideological differences with trustees from the original NGO (Maitri) from which the helpline was running, the helpline was relaunched under a new NGO, Muktaa Charitable Foundation. We would like to thank all of our counselors, donors and supporters for wholeheartedly standing behind us during this process of transition and change. The helpline has been given a new name 'Samvad HIV/ AIDS Helpline'.

The service has also been relocated to new premises given at a highly subsidized rent by a well wisher.

Helpline for Bihar

Muktaa are actively trying to target states in India, which are highly vulnerable for increased rates of HIV. We got the opportunity to start a helpline for Bihar. Counselors have been recruited from this area to provide over the phone HIV information and counseling. Initial response seems encouraging, suggesting a definite need for this service in this state.

Nalanda Foundation has graciously funded this project.

New Promotion Strategies

A new promotion officer has been appointed. The objective is to intensify our efforts to promote the helpline in rural areas. Use new mediums to reach the illiterate.

Small classified advertisements have been placed in various daily newspapers, to which we have had a very encouraging response.

Increasing number of callers is getting our helpline number from the internet such as our website, facebook and blogs.

Sending free SMS text promotions for our helpline seems to have been very successful.

Enhancing the Service

To meet the needs of the callers, new topics closely related to HIV like tuberculosis and hepatitis have been included in the scope of the helpline and training has been provided to the counselors for the same.

The senior counselors not only provide information and counseling related to HIV/AIDS, but are now trained to give life skill counseling in issues related to HIV/AIDS and sexuality.

Training/Workshops/Outings

Over the past year, volunteers and counselors have attended a variety of different trainings and workshops to improve skills and enhance knowledge. In turn, our service has also provided training to new counselors and lay individuals, on HIV information and counseling. We have also been on several trips as a team, to a variety of locations, to prevent staff burnout and promote team building.

New Core Group Members

Due to increased demands in our service, we felt the need for more members of our core group to help with management issues. We would like to welcome, Mrs. Vrinda Patharkar and Mr. Kishore Dhage to our team.

New Volunteers / Donors

Over the past year, we have had several new volunteers and donors supporting our helpline and we would like to thank them all for their support.

Saving A Life? Get Waste!

Over the last 2 years, a determined group of volunteers led by Suneeta Gadre has been regularly collecting old newspapers from Woodlands Society, and Saket Society Pune. The proceeds from selling the paper provide a vital source of donation for the helpline. Importantly, it connects a few hundred families to the fight against HIV. A total of Rs.1,65,848/- has been collected through this effort from 20/10/2008 until April 2011. Collections for the last year amount to 98,504/-.Volunteers involved in this unique effort include Anuradha Dhole, Shreya Bedekar, Anuradha Jog, Madhura Rohit, Anuradha Dhage,Bharat Dhanawale,Vishal and Shilpa Bhave.














Top 10 questions asked

Upcoming Events

- A refreshers training will be run in April this year for the senior counselors at the helpline, to update them on new developments in HIV knowledge.
- An outing is being arranged for the helpline counselors in May, to a peaceful rural location called Hidden Oasis. It is hoped that these outings support the counselor's emotional wellbeing and prevent future burnout.
- Two psychologists from the UK working in the field of HIV care will be visiting in July to run interactive teaching and workshops on psychosocial issues of HIV. In particular, they will be focusing on the issue of talking to children about HIV and the process of disclosure of a child's HIV diagnosis. They will also be helping the counselors learn how to manage repeat callers who show signs of excessive health anxiety.
